GOOD AFTERNOON CHAIRMAN MCDUFFIE AND MEMBERS
OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE JUDICIARY. I AM TOM FAUST,
DIRECTOR OF THE D.C. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS.

JOINING ME AT THE TABLE THIS AFTERNOON ARE DEPUTY
DIRECTOR FOR MANAGEMENT SUPPORT QUINCY BOOTH,
AND DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS TONI PERRY.
TODAY I WILL PROVIDE TESTIMONY AND RESPOND TO
QUESTIONS REGARDING THE DEPARTMENT'S
PERFORMANCE IN FISCAL YEARS 2015 AND 2016 TO DATE.

THE DOC SYSTEM INCLUDES TWO PRIMARY CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES—THE CENTRAL DETENTION FACILITY ALSO KNOWN AS THE D.C. JAIL AND THE CORRECTIONAL TREATMENT FACILITY, CURRENTLY OPERATED BY THE CORRECTIONS CORPORATION OF AMERICA UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE D.C. GOVERNMENT. DURING THE LAST YEAR, DOC PROCESSED ALMOST 10,000 INTAKES AND

RELEASES INCLUDING PRE-TRIAL DETAINEES, SENTENCED MISDEMEANANTS, FELONS AND PAROLE VIOLATORS.

IN ADDITION, THE DEPARTMENT CONTINUES TO CONTRACT WITH TWO PRIVATELY OPERATED COMMMUNITY

CORRECTIONS FACILITIES—HOPE VILLAGE AND FAIRVIEW--FOR HALFWAY HOUSE BED SPACE TO ACCOMMODATE UP

TO 50 MALE AND 15 FEMALE PRE-TRIAL COURT ORDERED

DEFENDANTS AND SENTENCED MISDEMEANANTS.

OUR MISSION IS TO ENSURE THE PUBLIC SAFETY OF
CITIZENS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA BY PROVIDING AN
ORDERLY, SAFE, SECURE AND HUMANE ENVIRONMENT FOR
THE CONFINEMENT OF PRETRIAL DETAINEES AND
SENTENCED INMATES, WHILE AFFORDING THOSE IN
CUSTODY MEANINGFUL OPPORTUNITIES FOR SUCCESSFUL
RE-INTEGRATION INTO THE COMMUNITY. OUR WORK AS

PUBLIC SAFETY PROFESSIONALS CONTRIBUTES TO THE SAFETY AND SECURITY OF OUR NEIGHBORHOODS AND CREATES PATHWAYS TO THE MIDDLE CLASS BY FULLY SUPPORTING REENTRY AND EMPLOYMENT READINESS AS INTEGRAL COMPONENTS OF OUR MISSION.

DURING FISCAL YEAR 2015, WE ACCOMPLISHED A GREAT
DEAL AS THE DCDOC TEAM WORKED COLLECTIVELY TO
ENHANCE OPERATIONS AND BROADEN PROGRAMMING
OPTIONS FOR INMATES IN OUR CUSTODY. I HAVE GREAT
PRIDE IN THE DCDOC WORKFORCE, NOT ONLY BECAUSE OF
THEIR DEDICATED WORK AS PUBLIC SAFETY
PROFESSIONALS BUT BECAUSE OF THE COMPASSION
DISPLAYED IN CARING FOR HUMAN LIVES AND
SUPPPORTING THE DISTRICT COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE. TO
MAKE A DIFFERENCE WE MUST ALL BE WILLING TO REACH
OUT AND HELP OTHERS. AND AS MAYOR BOWSER HAS

DEMONSTRATED THROUGH HER SAFER STRONGER DC
INITIATIVE, TOGETHER WE CAN KEEP OUR CITY BOTH SAFE
AND STRONG.

EFFECTIVE POPULATION MANAGEMENT REMAINS A
PRIORITY FOR THE DEPARTMENT. THROUGH A
COMMITMENT TO FORMING STRONG PATNERSHIPS WITH
OUR PUBLIC SAFETY AND FEDERAL PARTNERS, WE HAVE
BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN STREAMLINING PROCESSES THAT
ALLOW FOR THE EXPEDITIOUS MOVEMENT OF INMATES
FROM DISTRICT TO FEDERAL CUSTODY OR OTHER
JURISDICTIONS.

I HAVE ALSO PRIORITIZED EFFORTS TO NEGOTIATE A PER DIEM INCREASE WITH OUR FEDERAL STAKEHOLDERS FOR THE HOUSING OF FEDERAL INMATES. DURING 2015, WE WERE SUCCESSFUL IN ACHIEVING THAT GOAL WITH THE

PER DIEM INCREASED BY OVER FIFTEEN DOLLARS PER DAY.

THIS DIRECTLY BENEFITS DISTRICT TAXPAYERS PRIMARILY

BECAUSE FOR YEARS WE HAVE BEEN SUBSIDIZING

FEDERAL INMATES AT AN ANNUAL COST OF

APPROXIMATELY FOUR MILLION DOLLARS.

THE MOVEMENT OF INMATES IN AND OUT OF THE DCDOC SYSTEM TAKES PLACE THROUGH THE JAIL'S RECEIVING AND DISCHARGE FUNCTION. DURING JUNE OF 2015, WE OFFICIALLY OPENED THE STATE OF THE ART INMATE RECEPTION CENTER (IRC) NAMED IN HONOR OF DEPUTY DIRECTOR CAROLYN A. CROSS WHO WAS SLAIN IN SEPTEMBER OF 2014. THE INMATE RECEPTION CENTER IS THE CENTRALIZED POINT OF ENTRY AND EXIT FOR ALL INMATES REMANDED TO DCDOC CUSTODY. ADMISSION AND RELEASE FUNCTIONS ARE CO-LOCATED WITHIN THE IRC AND ENCOMPASS PROCESSES ASSOCIATED WITH

RECEIVING SUCH AS IRIS SCANNING, FINGERPRINTING,
PROPERTY INVENTORY AND STORAGE—CASE
MANAGEMENT SERVICES AND NEEDS ASSESSMENTS,
MEDICAL TRIAGE INCLUDING MENTAL HEALTH AND
SUICIDE PREVENTION SCREENINGS, RECORDS AND RELEASE
PROCESSING. BY CREATING A "ONE STOP SHOP" FUNCTION,
WE HAVE DECREASED WAIT TIMES AND SERVICE
DUPLICATION, ENHANCED RELEASE PLANNING, AND
CREATED AN ENVIRONMENT MORE CONDUCIVE TO THE
EFFICENT PROCESSING OF THE INMATE POPULATION.

LAST YEAR I WAS PROUD TO REPORT THAT IN DECEMBER OF 2014, AFTER AN EXTENSIVE AUDIT OF THE FACILITY BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, THE D.C. JAIL WAS OFFICIALLY CERTIFIED AS COMPLIANT WITH STANDARDS OF THE FEDERAL PRISON RAPE ELIMINATION ACT (PREA). THESE STANDARDS SET STRINGENT REQUIREMENTS THAT

COMPREHENSIVELY ADDRESS SEXUAL ABUSE IN ALL CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS HOUSING ADULT OR JUVENILE OFFENDERS.

WE REMAIN VIGILANT IN MAINTAINING THE STANDARDS
SET BY THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT FOR PREA COMPLIANCE.
IN THAT REGARD, DURING NOVEMBER OF 2015, OUR
CONTRACTED COMMUNITY CORRECTIONAL CENTERS, HOPE
VILLAGE FOR MALES AND FAIRVIEW FOR FEMALES, WERE
ALSO FOUND COMPLIANT WITH THE USDOJ PREA
STANDARDS AFTER COMPREHENSIVE AUDITS OF EACH
OPERATION-- FURTHER TESTAMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT'S
FULL COMMITMENT TO INSTITUTIONALIZING PREA
STANDARDS ACROSS FACILITIES.

THIS ACCOMPLISHMENT IS ESPECIALLY NOTEWORTHY AS

THE DISTRICT IS ONE OF ONLY THREE JURISDICTIONS IN THE

METROPOLITAN WASHINGTON REGION TO HAVE ACHIEVED PREA CERTIFICATION BY THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT. IN MAY OF THIS YEAR THE CENTRAL CELL BLOCK, OPERATED BY DOC, IS SCHEDULED TO UNDERGO AN AUDIT BY DOJ TO DETERMINE COMPLIANCE WITH PREA STANDARDS. AS WITH OUR OTHER FACILITIES, WE HAVE WORKED TO ENSURE THAT ALL PREA REQUIRED POLICIES, PROCEDURES AND OPERATIONAL PROTOCOLS ARE IN PLACE.

DURING 2015, THE DEPARTMENT IN COLLABORATION WITH UNITY HEALTHCARE ALSO ACHIEVED NATIONAL REACCREDITATION OF ITS MEDICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE DELIVERY SYSTEM BY THE NATIONAL COMMISSION ON CORRECTIONAL HEALTHCARE. AFTER A THOROUGH REVIEW OF OUR HEALTH CARE SERVICES, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES, IT WAS DETERMINED THAT DCDOC WAS THE GOLD STANDARD ACHIEVING 100%

COMPLIANCE WITH ALL REQUIRED HEALTHCARE STANDARDS.

AND IN JANUARY OF 2016, FOLLOWING AN EXTENSIVE

AUDIT OF THE D.C. JAIL COVERING ADMINISTRATION AND

MANAGEMENT, INSTITUTIONAL OPERATIONS, SERVICES,

AND INMATE PROGRAMS, THE FACILITY WAS AWARDED RE
ACCREDITATION BY THE AMERICAN CORRECTIONAL

ASSOCIATION AND THE COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION

FOR CORRECTIONS, A NOTEWORTHY ACHIEVEMENT AS

ONLY 7% OF JAILS NATIONALLY HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN

ACHIEVING ACA ACCREDITATION.

INMATE VISITATION IS ANOTHER CRITICAL COMPONENT OF
AGENCY OPERATIONS. WHILE THE VISITING PUBLIC
CONTINUES TO MAKE FULL USE OF OUR VIDEOCONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY BOTH AT OUR MAIN VIDEO

VISITATION CENTER AND OUR FOUR SATELLITE LOCATIONS. DURING 2015 WE IMPLEMENTED AN INCENTIVE BASED VISITATION COMPONENT THAT ALLOWS FAMILY MEMBERS AND FRIENDS TO ENTER THE FACILITY FOR IN-PERSON VISITATION (BEHIND THE PLEXIGLASS). INMATES WHO HAVE BEEN IN CUSTODY FOR 60 DAYS OR MORE AND WITHOUT DISCIPLINARY INFRACTIONS FOR AT LEAST 30 DAYS ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE. WE VIEW THIS OPTION AS A MEANS TO REWARD THE POPULATION FOR POSITIVE BEHAVIOR WHICH IN TURN ADDS TO THE ORDER AND SECURITY OF THE FACILITY. THE RESPONSE HAS BEEN POSITIVE WITH VISITORS COMMUNICATING APPRECIATION FOR A SECOND VISITATION OPTION.

DCDOC ALSO HAS RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CUSTODY OF
TITLE XVI YOUTH BEING ADJUDICATED AS ADULTS. THE 16
AND 17 YEAR OLD JUVENILE OFFENDERS IN OUR CUSTODY

ARE HOUSED AT THE CORRECTIONAL TREATMENT FACILITY
OUT OF THE SIGHT AND SOUND OF THE ADULT INMATE
POPULATION AS REQUIRED BY LAW. DCPS OPERATES AN
EDUCATIONAL COMPONENT ON THE HOUSING UNIT FIVE
DAYS A WEEK WITH ALL JUVENILES REQUIRED TO ATTEND
CLASS UNLESS INDIVIDUAL INSTRUCTION IS WARRANTED.

THE JUVENILE POPULATION ALSO PARTICIPATES IN A
STRUCTURED BEHAVIOR MODIFICATION PROGRAM THAT
REWARDS POSITIVE BEHAVIOR AND REINFORCES THE
IMPORTANCE OF PERSONAL ACCOUNTABILITY AS THEY
MOVE THROUGH THE BRONZE, SILVER AND GOLD TIERS.

DCDOC HAS BEEN ESPECIALLY PROACTIVE IN ADDRESSING
THE UNIQUE NEEDS OF OUR JUVENILE POPULATION. A
MULTIDISCIPLINARY TREATMENT TEAM MEETS ON A
WEEKLY BASIS TO ASSESS PROGRESS AND DETERMINE THE

MOST EFFECTIVE PROGRAMMING AND TREATMENT
OPTIONS FOR EACH YOUTH. A DEDICATED SOCIAL WORKER
POSITION WAS ESTABLISHED FOR THE JUVENILES WITH A
MENTAL HEALTH CLINICIAN HIRED JUST LAST MONTH WHO
PROVIDES INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP COUNSELING AND IS AN
ACTIVE PARTICPANT IN THE TREATMENT TEAM PROCESS.

AS AN ENHANCEMENT TO THIS PROCESS, ON A MONTHLY
BASIS PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS PARTICIPATE IN
CASE CONFERENCES TO HEAR FIRST HAND FROM
TREATMENT TEAM MEMBERS ABOUT PROGRESS BEING
MADE AND ISSUES ENCOUNTERED. THE FEEDBACK FROM
FAMILY MEMBERS HAS PROVEN BENEFICIAL WITH THEIR
BUY-IN HELPFUL AS THE TEAM MAKES IMPORTANT
PROGRAM AND TREATMENT DECISIONS. BY SEEKING THE
INVOLVEMENT OF FAMILY, WE REINFORCE THEIR VALUE AS
ACTIVE PARTICIPANTS IN THE REHABILITATION PROCESS.

WE HAVE ALSO INITIATED CONTACT TOUCH VISITS FOR
FAMILY MEMBERS ON HOLIDAYS, SPECIAL OCCASIONS AND
AS AN INCENTIVE FOR JUVENILES ACHIEVING GOLD TIER
STATUS, DEMONSTRATING GOOD CONDUCT AND MEETING
THEIR PROGRAM GOALS.

ALONG WITH JURISDICTIONS ACROSS THE COUNTRY WE
ARE EXAMINING OUR PROTOCOLS FOR RESTRICTIVE
HOUSING WITHIN DCDOC FACILITIES. TO PROACTIVELY
ADDRESS THIS ISSUE, I HAVE FORMED AN INTERNAL TEAM
TO REVIEW AND EVALUATE OUR POLICIES AND
PROCEDURES AND TO ESTABLISH SHORT AND LONG TERM
GOALS TO SAFELY REDUCE THE USE OF SEGREGATION OR
RESTRICTIVE HOUSING. THESE CHANGES MUST BE MADE IN
A PLANNED MANNER WHICH ENSURES THE SAFETY OF
BOTH STAFF AND OTHER INMATES.

I AM ALREADY IMPLEMENTING SIGNIFICANT CHANGES THAT INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING: ALL INMATES PLACED IN ADMINISTRATIVE RESTRICTIVE HOUSING WILL NOW RECEIVE A 7 DAY HOUSING REVIEW FOR THE FIRST 60 DAYS AND EVERY 14 DAYS THEREAFTER. THIS IS A CHANGE FROM WHAT WAS IN PLACE PREVIOUSLY WHICH WAS 7 DAYS FOR THE FIRST 60 DAYS AND EVERY 30 DAYS THEREAFTER. AND THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF DAYS AN INMATE MAY REMAIN IN DISCIPLINARY RESTRICTIVE HOUSING HAS BEEN REDUCED BY HALF FROM SIXTY TO THIRTY DAYS. IN ADDITION, OUT OF CELL TIME FOR RESTRICTIVE HOUSING IS BEING INITIALLY INCREASED BY ONE HOUR PER DAY.

WE ARE ALSO WORKING TOWARD OTHER OPTIONS
INCLUDING THE ELIMINATION OF RESTRICTIVE HOUSING
FOR JUVENILE OFFENDERS; ON-THE-UNIT SHORT TERM CELL
RESTRICTION FOR CERTAIN OFFENSES; AND COMMUNAL

RECREATION FOR RESTRICTED GROUPS. IN MOVING
FORWARD WE WILL CONTINUE TO LOOK AT VIABLE
OPTIONS THAT ALLOW FOR REDUCED RESTRICTIONS WHILE
SECURITY IS MAINTAINED AND STAFF SAFETY AND THE
SAFETY OF OTHER INMATES IS NOT COMPROMISED.

DURING FISCAL YEAR 2015, WE CONTINUED TO IDENTIFY
NEW AND INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS FOR THE INMATE
POPULATION. THEY INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

✓ THE PARTNERSHIP ESTABLISHED WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT SERVICES TO OPERATE THE WORK READINESS PROGRAM ON A DEDICATED HOUSING UNIT WITHIN THE JAIL. D.O.E.S HAS STAFFED THE PROGRAM WITH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SPECIALISTS THAT PROVIDE TRAINING TO PREPARE PARTICIPANTS FOR THE TRANSITION TO COMMUNITY BASED JOB READINESS ACTIVITIES.

- ✓ PARTNERSHIPS WITH OSSE AND THE UDC COMMUNITY

 COLLEGE TO PROVIDE CAREER AND TECHNICAL

 EDUCATION IN THE AREAS OF HOSPITALITY, CORE

 CONSTRUCTION AND JOB READINESS.
- ✓ OUR CONTINUING PARTNERSHIP WITH THE DC PUBLIC
 LIBRARY SUPPORTING THEIR FULL OPERATION OF A
 MOBILE LIBRARY WITHIN THE JAIL. THE DCPL TEAM
 OFFERS OUR POPULATION A FULL ARRAY OF READING
 AND LEARNING RESOURCES AND ENGAGES THEM IN
 OTHER INNOVATIVE READING ACTIVITIES.
- ✓ AN INNOVATIVE PARTNERSHIP FORGED WITH THE
 HOWARD UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY
 AND ANTHROPOLOGY TO OFFER A COURSE TITLED
 "CRIME AND JUSTICE BEHIND THE WALL". BOTH
 HOWARD UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND DCDOC INMATES
 PARTICIPATE FULLY IN COURSE ACTIVITY WITHIN THE
 JAIL SETTING. THE "INSIDE OUT" MODEL IS VERY

SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM FIRST ESTABLISHED BY
TEMPLE UNIVERSITY THAT FOCUSES ON THE SOCIAL
AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE CONSEQUENCES ASSOCIATED
WITH INCARCERATION.

DEPARTMENTAL PRIORITIES IN MOVING FORWARD INCLUDE
OPENING OUR MENTAL HEALTH STEP DOWN UNIT THIS
SPRING AS A JAIL-BASED THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY
FOCUSED ON FURTHER STABILIZING AND REINTEGRATING
THOSE DIAGNOSED WITH SERIOUS MENTAL ILLNESSES. WE
WILL ALSO CONTINUE ESTABLISHING ENHANCED
PROTOCOLS FOR RESTRICTIVE HOUSING; EXPANDING
PROGRAMMING OPTIONS FOR OUR JUVENILE POPULATION;
AND WORKING TOWARD ACHIEVEMENT OF PREA
CERTIFICATION FOR THE CENTRAL CELL BLOCK WHICH IS
SCHEDULED FOR AUDITING IN LATE MAY OF THIS YEAR.

FINALLY, BEFORE CLOSING I WOULD LIKE TO PUBLICLY
APPLAUD THE DCDOC WORKFORCE FOR AGAIN SURPASSING
ALL CITY AGENCIES IN D.C. ONE FUND CONTRIBUTIONS --WITH A TOTAL OF OVER \$113,000 DONATED TO DISTRICT
CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS BY OUR EMPLOYEES. THIS IS
THE FOURTH YEAR IN A ROW WE HAVE BEEN THE LEADING
AGENCY IN ONE FUND DONATIONS AS OUR EMPLOYEES
HAVE UNSELFISHLY GIVEN TO THOSE LESS FORTUNATE IN
OUR COMMUNITIES.
